WATERLOO COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS

CATEGORIES FOR AWARD NOMINATIONS

The Waterloo Commission on Human Rights wants to recognize local community advocates, employers, laborers, businesspersons, employees, tenants, elected officials, and other citizens for their work in securing freedom from discrimination on the basis of race, creed, sex, national origin, age, mental disability or physical disability.

SELECTION:

The Human Rights Commission Office will receive all nomination forms. A committee of five individuals consisting of Human Rights Commissioners and Community Representatives will review and recommend winners in each of the following categories:

COMMUNITY CITIZEN:

A volunteer or advocate for others promoting human or civil rights, diversity appreciation, prejudice reduction, or activities which uplift human dignity.

SERVICE SECTOR:

An employee, staff person, agency or organization in the Human Services field, volunteer groups, school board member, council person, board of supervisor or other elected official, city or county services, and the religious faith community.

PRIVATE SECTOR:

An employee/retiree or business representing retail, manufacturing, credit, health care, construction, union, law firm, etc.

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION:

An employee/retiree of an educational institution including administrative staff, professors, deans, teachers, coaches, maintenance, counselors, professional staff, clerical, etc.

HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSIONER:

A Human Rights Commissioner, past or present who served a minimum of three years is eligible to be recommended for this award.
